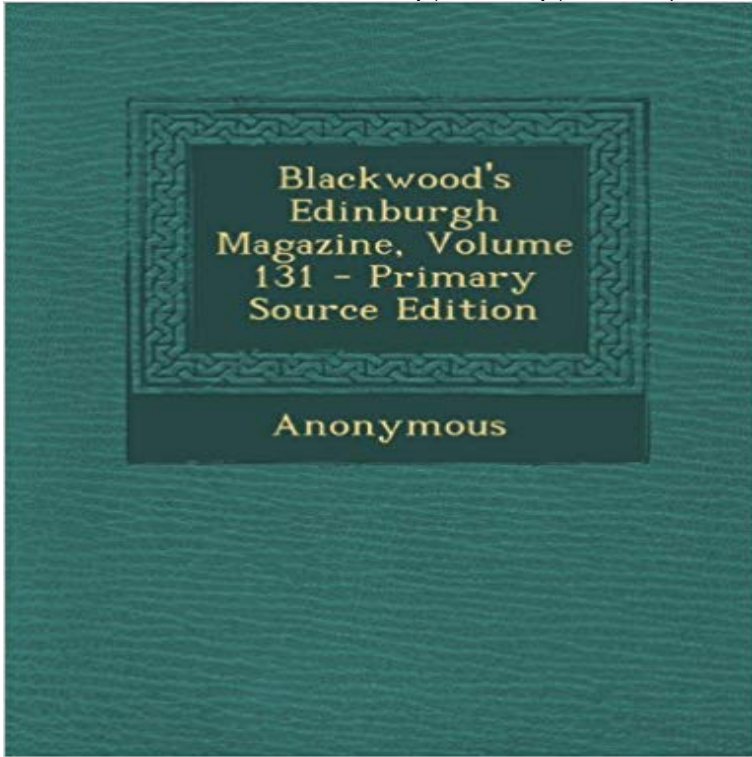


# Blackwoods Edinburgh Magazine, Volume 131
