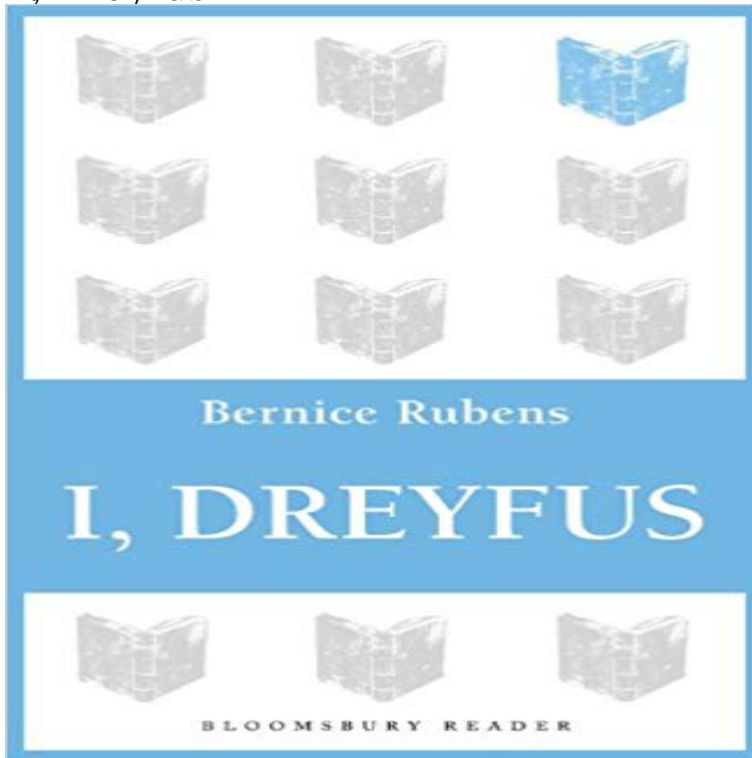


I, Dreyfus
