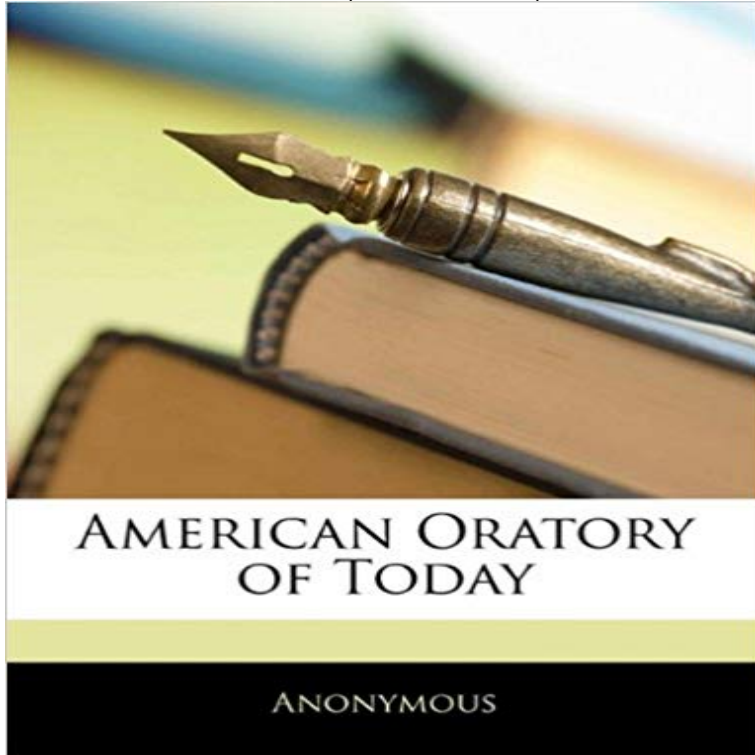


American Oratory of Today
