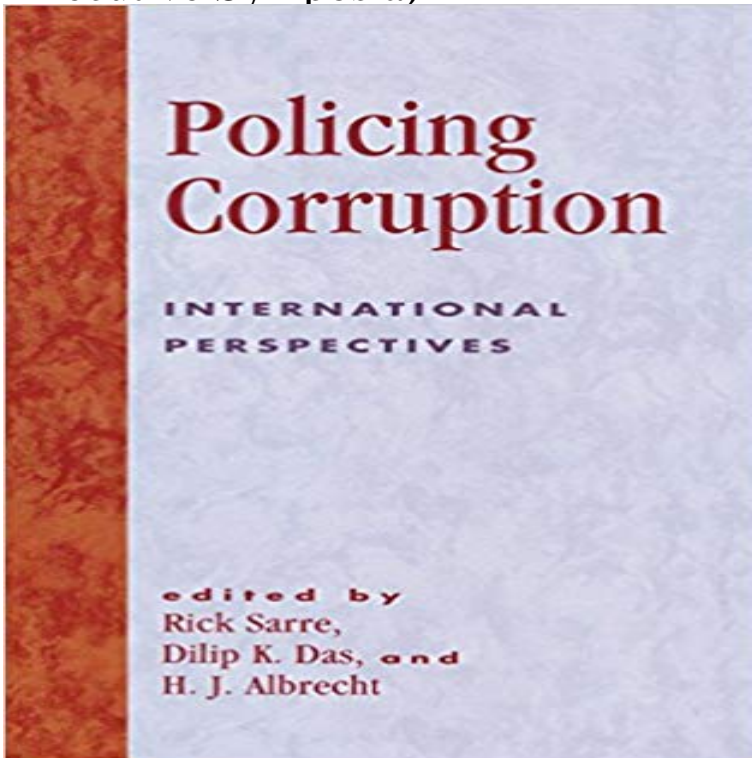


Policing Corruption: International Perspectives (International Police Executive Symposia)
