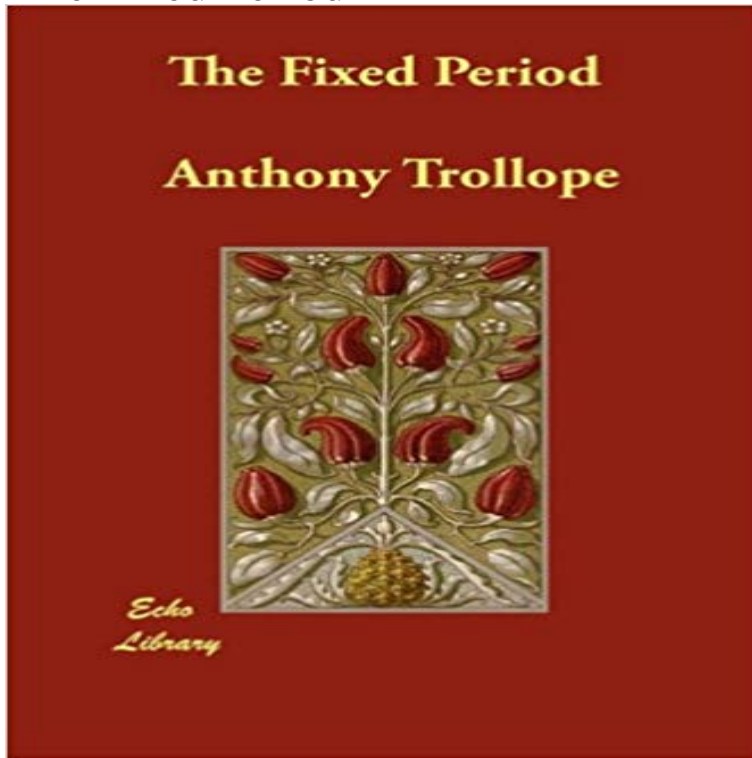


The Fixed Period
